

AP Jagananna Vidya Deevena Scheme

Introduction

- Jagananna Vidya Deevena Scheme is the flagship scheme of the Andhra Pradesh Government.
- It was started for the welfare of students studying the post metric courses.
- The main aim behind launching this to encourage students to pursue higher studies without fearing the fees of the course.
- Andhra Pradesh's Department of Social Welfare is the nodal department of this Jagananna Vidya Deevena Scheme.
- Under Andhra Pradesh Jagananna Vidya Deevena Scheme, Government of Andhra Pradesh will bear the full fees of the course in which the beneficiary is studying.
- Only the students belonging to SC, ST, BC, EBC Kapu, Minority and Differently Abled Category are eligible to avail the benefit under Jagananna Vidya Deevena Scheme.
- It is a Aadhar Enabled Direct Bank Transfer Scheme.
- In the initial phase of Jagananna Vidya Deevena Scheme, the course fee was directly transferred to the concerned College.
- But from 16-06-2020 the entire course fee is being transferred to the student's mother's bank account.
- The course fee will be paid in four instalments in an academic year.

Eligibility

- Student should be a resident of Andhra Pradesh.
- Family Income should not be more than Rs. 2.50 Lakhs.
- Student should belong to any of the below mentioned category :-
 - Schedule Caste.
 - Schedule Tribe.
 - Backward Class.
 - Economically Backward Class.
 - Kapu.
 - Minority.
 - Differently Abled.
- Family should hold below mentioned area of Land :-
 - Wet Land below 10 Acres.
 - Dry Land below 25 Acres.
 - Wet and Dry Land under 25 Acres.
- Student should be enrolled in any of the following institutions :-
 - Government Institutions.
 - Government Aided Institutions.
 - Private College Affiliated to State University or Board.
 - Day Scholar Student.
 - Student of College Attached Hostels.
 - Student of Department Attached Hostels.
- No Member of the Family should be in Government Services or a recipient of Pension.
- No Member of the Family should be a Income Tax Payer.
